IMPORTANT NOTICE - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY AND ALL CLEARANCES NEEDED FROM OTHER FEDERAL/STATE/LOCAL AGENCIES

The approval by the State Engineer of a permit grants an appropriation of water only, and does not grant any authority or permission to use the property of someone else.

If you do not own the land upon which your facility will be constructed, you should, before starting construction, take immediate steps to secure a permanent right-of-way.

If any part of the facility is located on State Land, and you are the lessee of record, communicate with the State Land Board for necessary applications for construction of improvements. If you are not the lessee of record, Land Board approval is needed for right-of-way, permits, or leases across or upon the leased area.

If the facility is to be located on Federal Lands, it will be necessary that you contact the appropriate agency, at one of the following locations, to determine the permitting/right-of-way acquisition procedures for the use of the proposed facility:

Following the correct permitting/right-of-way acquisition procedures will save you a great deal of unnecessary expense in the future, as any person subsequently filing on Federal Lands or purchasing State Lands, may claim damages, unless such right-of-way is made a matter of record and patent given subject to a right-of-way for existing facilities.

If privately owned lands are involved with this facility, right-of-way should be secured by written agreement from the land owner, securing sufficient land to properly allow any work that may be necessary. This written agreement should be made a matter of record in the Office of the County Clerk of the County in which the land is situated and the State Engineer's Office.

Construction of this facility may require the discharge of dredged or fill material into Wyoming water bodies and wetlands, including intermittent streams, as authorized by Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1344). The permittee is advised to contact the Corps of Engineers' office to determine if their proposed work requires authorization from that agency. Corps office is located as follows:

If the water right is for a source to be developed for human consumption serving 15 or more service connections, or 25 or more persons for 60 days or more of the year, then regulations developed under the Federal Safe Drinking Water Act and the provisions of Chapter III of the Wyoming Water Quality Rules and Regulations apply. You are advised that plans and specifications covering the proposed construction, installation, or modification of any system designed for this purpose are required to be submitted to and a permit to construct obtained prior to the start of construction.
