

**SUPPORT OF PRESERVING THE HISTORIC NAME OF  
DEVILS TOWER**

**RESOLUTION NO. 1864**

WHEREAS, on September 24, 1906, President Theodore Roosevelt recognized the unique attributes of Devils Tower by declaring it the first United States National Monument, protecting the Tower and adjacent land for posterity; and

WHEREAS, for over one hundred years Devils Tower has been identified by citizens universally as a distinct and sacred geologic formation, with annual visits of nearly half a million people; and


WHEREAS, the Campbell County Board of Commissioners stand united with other surrounding counties and municipalities in recognition of the significant historical, cultural, spiritual, recreational and economic importance of "Devils Tower" to northeastern Wyoming, the State of Wyoming, the nation and the world;


**NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND RESOLVED** the Campbell County Board of Commissioners is in support of preserving the historic name of "Devils Tower" and encourages the President, the United States Congress, and all Federal Agencies including the United States Department of the Interior, the National Park Service, the United States Postal Service, and the United States Board of Geographic Names to decline changing the name of "Devils Tower" and choose to protect and preserve its historic name and prominence to all people of this great land.
